Financial Reports were presented by WSAA Treasurer, Suzanne Joy.

Hunting VP Jason Bolser said game management is flux of changing times. Number of permits to be given. Said elk hunting may become by permit only. We have a tough fight ahead.

NASP Committee report given by Linda Parker. A successful year with return to in-person State Championship competition and met goal of recruiting and equipping 10+ new schools. Full report is in this issue.

Quiver Editor report given by Linda Parker. Transition to quarterly vice monthly production fairly smooth, no push-back from membership. Advertising revenue plummeted. Again, Editor made a plea for input.

District 1 report given by Steve Love.

District 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 no report, Districts 7 and 8 need filled.

Update of 3D tournament rules reviewed with general meeting members.

Dates for Calendar Shoots were presented.

Additions and some adjustments were entered.

Hosts for 2024 WSAA Championship Tournaments were voted on.

WSAA Indoor Multi-Color - one east and one west bid, both accepted. Will be host by Wa-Ku-Wa Archers and Silver Arrow Bowmen.

WSAA Indoor Blueface - only two bids submitted, both west side, both accepted to accommodate the number of archers expected. WCW and Orion Indoor Archery. Orion will also (concurrently) host the NFAA NW Indoor Sectional.

WSAA State Safari to be Hosted by Silver Arrow Bowmen.

WSAA 3D to be Hosted by Silver Arrow Bowmen.

WSAA Field to be Hosted by WCW in Kenmore.

WSAA Target Hosted by WCW

EXECUTIVE VP: Linda Parker REPORT FOR CONVENTION 2023

As we wrap up another year, my role and activities as Executive Vice President remain about the same. I frequently receive queries via our website or Facebook page with general archery questions - where to buy equipment, where to practice, how to learn, and how to start competing. I refer those queries mostly to our list of WSAA Chartered Clubs and Shops on our website, and single out the facilities closest to them or most able to meet their needs.

I have helped encourage Clubs or Shops to charter with WSAA or to renew lapsed charters. I think VanWinkle's Archery in Everett came back to us because of my contact. And Wildlife Committee of Washington renewed both with WSAA and with NFAA after some discussion. Welcome to those and any that I may have missed hearing about.

In June I had a catastrophic hard drive failure that wiped out ALL my files for the past many years. I've been able to recover some documents because if I ever emailed it to someone, and remember who / when / filename, I can sometimes get it back. But the files that I miss the most are my database of WSAA members / clubs / shops, and my database of NASP schools and certified instructors. I have made visits to a couple clubs this year, including Capital City Bowmen and Darrington Archers, and hope to attend a few more in the coming year. I do miss shooting and competing but will continue to stay in touch with the sport by traveling for some social contact.

I am willing to continue as Executive VP for another year.

QUIVER EDITOR: Linda Parker REPORT FOR CONVENTION 2023

This has been our first year operating under the new policy of only publishing The Quiver quarterly, with issues prepared for mailing to our members January, April, July, and October.

I regulate the timing of my production starting with an announcement requesting input by the 10th of the prior month, then give myself until about 17-20th of the month to get it all put together. I send the file to the printer (L&L Printing in Puyallup) and request the Treasurer for a count on how many copies to get printed and for her to send the mailing list.

At the same time, I post the color version of The Quiver on the WSAA Website and make an announcement on Facebook that it is available for viewing or downloading. So, people can read the online version a week or two earlier than receiving it in the mail.

Having only four issues, our advertising revenue has plummeted. The only paid ads this year have been from Grays Harbor Bowmen and Capital City Bowmen. I hope the amount of advertising rebounds next year but may be a symptom of Clubs getting enough exposure with social media and local posting. Also, this causes some of our issues to be heavy on tournament score reports and registration flyers. Note the WSAA Indoor Multi-Color, Indoor Blueface, and Blueface Mail-In all listed in this January issue.

I haven't had any negative feedback from the members on the decrease in number of issues produced, but it has caused some confusion from people wondering if they are still members because they didn't receive anything on the off months. Clubs DO need to plan a little farther in advance, as for example the July issue is too late to advertise an event on the first weekend of the month.

I am willing to continue another year as Editor. But I would like to repeat my usual plea for INPUT. Send your Club and Shop News, tournament reports, hunting stories or advice, or ADVERTISING.

NASP Report for Convention 2023 Linda Parker, WA-NASP State Coordinator

Washington State Archery Association / WA-NASP is again happy to report a successful year supporting the National Archery in the Schools Program.

During this year, with help from Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife, we have recruited, trained, and equipped THIRTEEN new schools that will implement archery instruction as part of their in-school curriculum.

These schools are:

Pathfinder K8 Seattle Adams Elementary Seattle Seattle Seattle Classical Christian School Bear Creek Campus Woodinville Saint Brendan Catholic School Bothell Sage Crest Elementary Kennewick Westgate Elementary Kennewick Mountainside Middle School Colbert Skyline Elementary School Spokane Jenkins Jr-Sr High School Chewelah Garfield School District Garfield Oakesdale School Oakesdale Steilacoom High School (JROTC) Steilacoom



Steilacoom High School equipment was funded by US Army for JROTC. Seattle Classical Christian School and Saint Brendan Catholic School were equipped using refurbished targets and bows returned by North Kitsap High School which has dropped their archery program after several active years.

During this year, we have conducted 17 sessions of Basic Archery Instructor certification training with 116 successful graduates. The new hybrid training model (which combines four hours of online training and a four-hour in-person field day) has allowed us to cut the travel costs associated with these classes because in most cases we will not require overnight lodging and per diem costs.

Again, we conducted the NASP Washington State Championship and NASP-WA 3D Challenge events distributed across four locations on two weekends during March 2023, to accommodate the schools / archers desiring to participate. The sites were Deer Park High School (Deer Park), Darrington School and Community Center (Darrington), Enterprise Middle School (West Richland), and Whitstran Elementary School (Prosser). We had 596 archers compete in the Championship tournament and 371 for the 3D Challenge.

We were pleased to award \$7000 in scholarships to tournament participants, including \$1500 each to the Top Male and Top Female Bullseye archers, \$1000 each to the Top Male and Top Female 3D Challenge archers, \$1000 for the Wolf Spirit Award, \$500 for the Evergreen Spirit Award, and \$500 for the new Diamond Ace award. WA-NASP paid half of this amount (generated from tournament registration fees) which was matched by the NASP Foundation.

We continued our involvement with the SHAPE Conference for our contact with Physical Education teachers to recruit new programs. We set up an indoor range, demonstrated our teaching technique, and allowed participants to shoot the Genesis bows and arrows under our instruction.

The above report covers the 2022-2023 school / NASP year. So far already since 1 July, we have recruited and trained FIVE new schools, and have re-activated Chief Joseph Middle School after a few years lapse.

The WA-NASP bank account which was authorized last year and held up by some Washington Secretary of State red tape was finally successfully setup and funded in March 2023, just in time to process receipts and pay expenses for the WA-NASP State Championship 2023. The event did a little better than break-even financially, even funding of the NASP scholarships. Our Basic Archery Instructor classes work to generate income for the program, because we charge more than the classes cost.

All the equipment purchased to setup new schools, plus our volunteer travel for conducting the NASP State Championship tournaments and for presenting the BAI classes, has been reimbursed by WDFW.

For 2024, we are planning a two-day, single-site State Championship Tournament. The location we are planning is the Benton County Fairgrounds. Good news is that the site is available and is large enough to accommodate our expected number of participants. Downside is the cost of facility rental and event insurance costs. Most of the event costs are covered by participant entry fees, augmented by spectator admission collected. However, to ensure we break even on the event, we are seeking sponsorships from our affiliated Clubs and Shops and WSAA members, and will also contact relevant businesses in the community. National Field Archery Association WA State Director - TC Parker

- 2023 Board of Directors Meeting Report

Meeting was held at NFAA Headquarters - Yankton, South Dakota - Monday August 28, 2023, with about half of the Directors present onsite and others (including Washington Director TC Parker) attending via Zoom.

A substantial number of Agenda Items were considered, with relatively few of them passing. The changes which did pass will become effective January 1st, 2024

NFAA website www.NFAAUSA.com has been substantially revised, with many new features. There is now a Club and shop locator. Sectional and State pages. Clubs and Shops are Encouraged to check and update their own record.

Agenda Items which PASSED are listed below:

FULL copy of these minutes is available on the NFAA website in the "Resources" section.

HQ-01: Revision, Constitution, Page 10-11, Article 3 Section A Para 3, 10; Item 3.2 - This change allows a member to designate their choice of affiliated state, regardless of their state of residence.

CA-02: Passed, to remove the entire section addressing the provision that Membership in USA Archery may be substituted for the NFAA membership requirements for the purpose of competing in NFAA tournaments)

CT-03: The maximum total width of the archer and all their equipment may not extend into the adjacent shooting lanes

CA-07: Longbow style addition of item J.6.Finger position cannot change during a competition.

CA-03: Added Barebow Recurve to the styles recognized in the all Divisions.

C-05: Pros from other archery organizations had been required to be NFAA Pros. DELETE that requirement.

C-11: Break the Barriers & NFAA 3D Open tournament is added as an official National 1-Arrow Marked 3-D.

C-03: The NFAA is now taking registration for sectional events directly from members instead of the members registering through their host location. late registration fees for sectional events can be charged at the discretion of NFAA HQ, and will be split 50/50 between HQ and the Host Club.

C-10: If an archer shoots more than the prescribed number of arrows in an end, the excess arrow or arrows of higher value will not be scored. A penalty of one scoring ring (1 point and 1 X if applicable) will be assessed for each arrow shot over the prescribed number of arrows. If an archer shoots less than the prescribed number of arrows in one end he/she may shoot his/her remaining arrows if the omission is discovered prior to advancing to the target; otherwise, they shall be scored as misses.

C-07: Self-guided range inspections will be permitted for all Indoor and Outdoor Target ranges and Field and 3D range renewals provided no range layout changes have occurred. The NFAA Director will still be required to review and approve all completed inspection forms, and the NFAA will require pictures and/or videos to ensure range safety and range requirements are met.

C-08: The NFAA Tournament Officials Program should be revamped. The new program should include clear requirements, different certification levels, and a layout of classes that can be taken online and renewed periodically. *An online Judge Certification course is now available.*

C-02: Policy to add collegiate divisions on a trial basis for the next 4 years (2024-2027) as optional divisions for all NFAA events hosted throughout the calendar year (state, sectional, and national). Divisions to be recognized are: Male & Female - Freestyle, Freestyle Limited Recurve, Barebow Recurve, and Bowhunter Freestyle

C-06: For all national and sectional tournaments where Guardian Angels are used to accompany Cub groups, the NFAA Council shall determine the process for screening individuals to serve as Guardian Angels and the number of required pre-screened individuals required to be onsite for each tournament. The requirements shall be outlined in the national and sectional contracts.

C-12: Aan increase in dues. The new rates are reflected in the Membership Application form in this issue of The Quiver.

AZ-08: Barebow Recurve rules revised to match World Archery's rules to allow weights on any part of the riser -

5. Weights and / or vibration dampeners are permitted. The bow, with any combination of weights and vibration dampeners installed must meet the requirement of paragraph 6 (must pass through a ring with an inside diameter of 12.2 cm (+/- 0.5mm)) without having to flex vibration dampeners to fit through the ring. Weights and dampeners may be added below and above the riser's grip but must not aid the athlete in aiming or ranging in any way.

AZ-07: There is an outline of a circle printed on the Animal Round target as a guide to place the bonus dot. The bonus dots are sold separately. Sometimes the dots are accidentally put onto the target face off-center of the circle.

An arrow shaft must touch the bonus dot to be counted in the next higher value. Arrows touching the orientation line will not count for the higher value.

An Archery Club is a group of people who have joined together to enjoy their sport. Most Clubs have an Indoor or an Outdoor range, or both. Many have a clubhouse for group gatherings. However, property is not necessary to be a Club.

All it takes to BECOME a Chartered Club, is THREE ADULT Club members, that are members of WSAA.

At the time your charter is due for renewal, you will need a minimum of SEVEN adult WSAA members.

An Archery Shop is a store which offers sales and service of archery equipment, and often other lines of sporting goods. Several Shops also have Indoor Lanes, and may operate Leagues. A few also have an outdoor range or run an outdoor tournament. To become a Chartered Shop, the Owner or the Manager of the Shop must be a WSAA member

If your Club or Shop isn't listed here, or for questions about the status of your Club or Shop, or to update or correct listed info, contact Treasurer / Membership Services. (see the Officers, Board and Committee list in this issue for phone and email address).



WSAA Blueface Mail-In 1 February - 15 March 2024

The indoor Blueface Mail-in Tournament consists of six rounds shot over a period of two months using the NFAA Blueface indoor target, single or five-spot face. The distance shot will be 20 yards. Cub and PeeWee distance will be 10 yards. Each round is 12 ends of 5 arrows each, total 60 arrows.

NFAA rules will apply to all Divisions and Styles. Divisions: Male and Female in all NFAA groups: Pro, Senior Pro (50+), Adult (18+), Senior (50+), Silver Senior (60+), Master Senior (70+), Young Adult (15-17), Youth (12-14), Cub (8-11) and PeeWee (under 8). Styles: All Pro Divisions shoot Freestyle only.

Adults, Seniors, Silver Seniors and Master Seniors shoot Freestyle, Freestyle Limited, Barebow, Bowhunter Freestyle, Traditional, Freestyle Limited Recurve, or Barebow Recurve. Adults ONLY may shoot Longbow.

Juniors (under 18 years of age) shoot Freestyle, Bowhunter Freestyle, Barebow, Freestyle Limited Recurve, and Barebow Recurve. An archer may shoot additional rounds and compete in more than one style (e.g., Freestyle and Bowhunter Freestyle), but may not compete in more than one age division within the same style. Separate registration is required for each category.

All competitors must be current WSAA members, except out of state shooters who are members of their own state or province archery association or the WSAA and provide proof at time of registration.

All scores must be shot at a WSAA chartered club or shop, including a temporary indoor range arranged by a chartered club or shop. Scores shot at the WSAA Blueface Championship and/or the NFAA Indoor Sectional (Washington location) may be counted as mail-in scores if declared before official practice begins.

Deadline for registration is 15 February 2024. All forms and fees must be **received** by this date.


HELP WANTED:

SPONSOR REQUEST

Washington State Archery Association is the lead agency for the National Archery in the Schools Program (NASP) in our state. We recruit new schools in the program, assist them with grants for purchase of their startup equipment, and offer Basic Archery Instructor (BAI) certification training for their teachers.

Since 2006, WA-NASP has conducted an annual State Championship Tournament as a culminating event for students representing schools in the program. The tournament concludes with presentation of individual and team trophies and the event awards a total of \$7000 in scholarships to the top archers. Over the years, we have seen the tournament grow from initial number of 48 archers. In 2016, we exceeded capacity of any single site with almost 1000 archers and expanded the event to three satellite sites with the final rounds and awards ceremony conducted at Central Washington University in Ellensburg. Then in 2017 we added a second concurrent event - the IBO NASP 3D Challenge. Participation continued to grow to a high of just over 1100 in 2020, despite being disrupted by COVID restrictions. 2021 and 2022 events were conducted virtually, with archers shooting at their own schools so their coach could submit their scores to be tabulated against their peers across the state. And our 2023 event resumed the satellite / distributed format with numbers returning to prior levels.

For 2024, we had a goal of returning the competition format to a single site and have identified a location - the Benton County Fairgrounds in Kennewick WA. Event is scheduled for 8-9 March 2024. To provide this experience for the students within our budget, we are seeking sponsors from the communities we serve. ANY AMOUNT will help! YOUR donation of \$100 or more will be recognized by announcement in the tournament program and posting a sign at the tournament venue. Please send your donation (Check payable to WA-NASP) by mail to the address above. If you provide a banner (size 3' x 5' or smaller) your sign will be hung above the targets on either the Bullseye or the 3D Challenge range.


