### Officers, Board and Committee Reports

### **TOURNAMENT VICE PRESIDENT: Sam Sturza**

Multi-Color Championship, Multi-Color Mail-In, and Blueface Championship results have been shared on Facebook and also posted on the WSAA website. This has been a prolonged process because of need to receive results from the multiple sites and to verify membership / eligibility for these events. We went through several iterations of preliminary results, but they should now all be settled. Next to work on the Blueface Mail-In, and the WSAA Safari Championship registration in progress.

I was not able to attend WSAA Blueface Championship this year. It was too stressful traveling with my dog for the WSAA Multi-Color, and it's too early to leave her with someone else. Both sites emailed me results and / or mailed the score cards. My attendance for WSAA Safari is currently TBD.

I was going to wait until the board meeting, but now is as good if time as any to announce that this will be my final year in this role as Tournament VP. ### **WSAA EXECUTIVE VP: Linda Parker**

The WSAA President - Scott Melton - announced during the WSAA Convention in October 2023 that he would not be continuing in that role. Due to lack of nominations, we did not elect a successor during Convention, so the position has de facto been vacant since 1 January 2024. With busy schedules, we have not held the usual First Quarter Board Meeting, so the position of President is still vacant. According to the WSAA Constitution and By-Laws, "In the absence or disability of the President, the Executive Vice-President shall perform the duties of President" so I have technically been performing that role, although I have been preoccupied the past several months with planning and execution of the NASP Washington State Championship. Also, according to the WSAA By-Laws, "Any resignation or vacancy on the Board of Directors occurring after the annual convention shall be filled by appointment by the remaining members of the Board of Directors. Approval for appointments to fill vacancies on the Board of Directors may, if necessary to expedite the business



of this association, be by mail ballot or by telephoning the current Board of Directors. The appointment to fill the vacancy shall be for the remainder of the unexpired term."

We have one person who has submitted himself for consideration for the President position - Rodger Joy, who is spouse of our Treasurer Suzanne Joy, has been a member of WSAA and NFAA for several years, and has previously served as our Tournament VP. We have no other candidates at this time, so his appointment will probably be confirmed during the Second Quarter Board Meeting to be conducted in April.

In addition to my NASP activities during this quarter, I have been active in posting and maintaining information about WSAA in the WSAA Facebook Page and on our Facebook Group. Beyond that, I have started process of making additions to the WSAA Website. You may know that our previous website www.WashingtonArchery.org which was created by Ray Crisp has not been renewed and is now no longer accessible. Most or all the association's documents are on a Google Drive and therefore still available, but not easy to navigate. I have added a Tournaments section to the main page of our new website www.WashingtonStateArchery.com and have posted some documents there, starting with the WSAA Tournament Rules and Procedures and the Current Year Results. If you have ideas or the time to help with this project, please speak up.

And as a final general statement - our Board has not been hitting on all cylinders recently, due to several vacancies and divided attention / lack of energy among those of us still in position. If you care about organized archery, bowhunting opportunity, beginning archery training, archer recruitment, or any relevant topic, PLEASE step up and pick up part of the load. I always say that "many hands make light work" and there are several activities that NEED to have multiple people involved in them to counterbalance and share the work.

### NASP® Washington 2024 State Championship Tournament and Scholarships

The Washington National Archery in the Schools Program (NASP®) is excited about our Washington State Championship tournaments conducted 8-9 March 2024, at the Benton County Fairgrounds in Kennewick WA, as two events: The State Championship (bullseye) and IBO 3-D Challenge competition.



Top teams and individuals received trophies and plaques, and also qualify to register for the National Championship event to be conducted in April in Utah. Top male and female individual winners plus those selected for the Diamond ACE, Wolf Spirit, and Evergreen Spirit Awards received scholarships funded by Washington State Archery Association and the NASP® Foundation. Upon graduation from high school, archers can apply these funds to any post-secondary educational or training program of their choice.

NASP® Washington has had a fantastic year. More schools and more student archers are experiencing the in-school lessons and participating in the competitions. These tournaments are the culminating events for student archers who have been practicing and competing since the fall. It is wonderful to see them enter the tournament halls with families and supporters to take part in our events."

### **Individual Scholarships**

- Top male and female finishers from the Bullseye event receive a \$1500 scholarship.
- Top male and female finishers from the 3D Challenge receive \$1000.
- Diamond ACE Award winner receives \$1000
- Wolf Spirit Award winner receives \$500
- Evergreen Spirit Award winner receives \$500

### **ABOUT NASP®**

The National Archery in the Schools Program continues to bring safe in-school archery to 1.3 million students each year in 49 U.S. states. Since inception in 2002, NASP® has involved over 21 million students and over 104,000 adult instructors! The culminating event for thousands of these students is participation in a local, regional, state, or national tournament event, and

Washington State enrolled in NASP® in 2005, with 13 initial schools attending a kick-off training to certify their coaches as Basic Archery Instructors (BAI). We conducted our first tournament in April 2006, with 48 archers participating. In 2023, we hosted 596 archers for the Bullseye event and 371 for the 3D Challenge. For the 2024 event, we had 720 registered for the Bullseye representing 34 schools and 430 from 25 schools for the 3D Challenge. We currently have 240 schools active with NASP across the state.

### ELLA OGDEN NAMED "Diamond ACE" Award Winner 2024

The Diamond ACE Award recognizes the multi-faceted legacy of Clarkston Schools' Maggie Ogden. This Washington NASP award is given to the student athlete who demonstrates outstanding all-around achievement in the areas of Athletics / Archery, Community Service, and Education. This award goes to a graduating senior with a multi-year record of excellence in these areas.

This award is not about the best score or highest GPA. It recognizes the goal of the National Archery in the Schools Program (NASP), to have archery play a positive part in a student's overall development and educational performance.

The Winning Archer receives a plaque and a \$1000 scholarship.



WSAA Tournament Rules and Procedures applicable to the WSAA 3D Championship have been significantly revised from previous years. The primary considerations affect:

Event is a 60-target Known Distance Round, with host to determine number of targets per day Barebow Recurve style is recognized for all Divisions

IBO style scoring will be used for the regular 60-target round

There will be a five-target shoot-off on Sunday among the top five in categories with at least 5 archers.

*OPA style scoring (with colored 12-rings and 14-ring) will be used for the shoot-off*

### **WSAA 3D Championship Tournament Rules**

### **GENERAL**

- The official rules of the NFAA shall govern this tournament except as noted in these WSAA rules.
- 2. The 3D Championship shall consist of one 60-target Known Distance round, one arrow per target, at known (by archer's rangefinder) distances, shot over two days. Host to determine the number of targets shot per day.
- 3. The targets will be 3-D foam animals. Target distances, type and size will be at the option of the tournament host.
  - a. The host may use existing field / safari / 3D ranges. 3-D targets may be placed in front of existing butts if necessary for safety reasons or for access to the target.
  - b. Stake colors and target distances are:
    - (1) Adult, Senior, Silver Senior, Master Senior, Young Adult orange stakes, maximum 60 yards.
    - (2) Youth will usually shoot from the Adult (orange) stakes unless the distance exceeds the youth maximum of 45 yards or in case the shot is unusually difficult from the adult stake. Then a blue stake, which must be clearly visible from the orange stake, shall be used.
    - (3) Barebow Recurve, Traditional and Longbow Styles shall have their own (purple) stake; maximum distance 35 yards.
    - (4) Cubs (black stakes) should be <u>approximately</u> one-half the distance of the Youth stakes up to a maximum distance of 25 yards.
    - (5) PeeWee (green stakes) should be <u>approximately</u> one-half the distance of the Cub stakes up to a maximum of 15 yards.
    - (6) High School NASP shooters will shoot from the Black stakes and Elementary and Middle School shooters will use the Green stakes.
- 4. **Divisions:** Pro, Senior Pro, Adult (18+), Senior (50+), Silver Senior (60+), Master Senior (70+), Young Adult (15-17), Youth (12-14), Cub (8-11) and PeeWee (under 8). Male and Female categories will be provided in all Divisions.
  - a. Archers will use their age at the start of the tournament to determine their division.
  - b. An archer aged 50 and older may compete as an Adult or <u>Senior</u>. Archers aged 60 and older may compete as an Adult, Senior or Silver Senior. Archers aged 70 and older may compete as an Adult, Senior, Silver Senior, or Master Senior.
  - c. Junior archers may elect to compete in any higher age division up through Adult with written parental consent. The Tournament VP will hold this letter. Once this option has been exercised, the archer may not revert.
  - d. We invite archers attending schools in the National Archery in the Schools Program (NASP) to compete in this event. NASP age groups are Elementary (grades 4-5), Middle School (grades 6-8) and High School (grades 9-12). NASP Division shoots Saturday only.

### Styles:

- a. Adults, Seniors, Silver Seniors, and Master Seniors shoot Freestyle, Freestyle Limited, Bowhunter Freestyle, Barebow, Traditional, Freestyle Limited Recurve, and Recurve Barebow. Adults ONLY may shoot Longbow.
- b. <u>Juniors (under 18 years of age)</u> shoot Freestyle, Bowhunter Freestyle, Barebow, Freestyle Limited Recurve, and Barebow Recurve.
- d. <u>NASP Division</u> archers shoot NASP equipment style only. (Original Genesis Bow without modification, full-length 1820 Aluminum Arrows, NO Sights.)
- 6. NFAA equipment rules will apply to all styles, except there is no speed limit or draw weight limit. Equipment may be subject to inspection at any time during the tournament day. Arrow shaft diameter is not to exceed .422" (27/64) with points no larger than .425". Lighted nocks are not allowed.

### **SHOOTING RULES**

- 1. The group will determine a shooting order and rotate at each target.
- 2. Each archer will shoot their arrows with one foot touching the appropriate stake for the division and style in which they are registered. Failure to touch the stake will cause the arrow to be "no score".
- 3. After assuming a position at the stake, the first shooter has two minutes to shoot. Every archer in the group after the first shooter has one minute to shoot. Shooters are allowed two let downs per target

- 4. No shooter may glass the target while standing at the shooting stake after shooting their arrow.
- 5. Targets must be shot in numerical order. An intentionally skipped target) may not be shot later and the archer will record a score of zero for all targets skipped.
- 6. This is a one-arrow per target shoot.
  - a. Scoring will be: center scoring ring = 12; second scoring ring (vital circle) = 10; third scoring area (kill) = 8; any part of the animal outside the scoring rings except antlers and horns (wound) = 5. The arrow shaft needs only touch the line or animal to score the higher value (see also rule 15.d.)
  - b. For the SHOOT-OFF, Targets will use OPA style scoring with a colored 14 Ring OUTSIDE of the 10-point area, and both upper and lower 12 Ring; second scoring ring (vital circle) = 10; third scoring area (kill) = 8; any part of the animal outside the scoring rings except antlers and horns (wound) = 5.

### The scoring is as follows:

Potential scores on each 3D animal are 14, 12, 10, 8, 5, and 0 points.


14 is an existing ring on the 3D target and is colored pink.

12 is an existing ring on the 3D target and is colored orange.

Shooter must call if he or she is shooting for the 14-ring (pink).

When a 14 is called, the shooter cannot score a 10 or 12.

The arrow shaft need only touch the line or animal to score the higher value (see also rule 14.d.).



- 13. The first arrow is for score. There is no practice target.
- 14. All arrows must be in the target to score.
  - a. Witnessed bounce-outs and pass-throughs shall be re-shot. A suspected pass-through may be re-shot with a marked arrow, which will not be scored if the first arrow is found and is scoreable.
  - b. Glance-off arrows do not score.
  - c. Arrows embedded past the nock may be pushed back until the shaft can be seen for scoring.
  - d. An arrow embedded in an object behind the target will be scored a miss (glance-off) unless the shaft is completely surrounded by intact target material.
- 24. A five-target shoot-off will be held on Sunday afternoon among the top five archers in each category with five or more competitors. For those top five archers, their previous score carries into the shoot-off.
  - a. The winners of categories with fewer than five archers are the archers with the highest score in each division and style Ties for first place will be broken by a one-arrow shoot-off on the practice range or course with an appropriate distance and target size. The arrow closest to the 12-ring is the winner. Repeat until a winner is determined.
  - b. Awards will be presented according to the unit rule. The unit rule determines the <u>number of archers</u> receiving awards in each division and style. One award for 1-3 shooters, two awards for 4-6 shooters, three if there are 7 or more. Places (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>) will be determined by the number of awards allowed and whether there are ties. The number of awards presented may be increased if there are ties for the last place allowed by the unit rule.
  - c. If a competitor is not present for a shoot-off, he/she will place below the other archer(s) tied for first, as allowed by the unit rule.
  - d. Ties for second and third place will be broken by the most 12-rings or given equal awards if still tied, as allowed by the unit rule.



### WSAA RECOGNIZES HUNTER ACHIEVEMENT

### **WSAA Big Game Awards**

The Washington State Archery Association sponsors a Big Game Award program to recognize its member archers who take big game animals with the bow and arrow. Big game animals considered for this award are listed in the box below. In addition, turkeys and bobcats taken in Washington also are eligible for this award.

The award consists of a yew wood "stump" mounted on a black, bell-shaped base, commonly called the "stump award". The recipient's name is engraved on a silver-like plate attached to the base, and a specially prepared broadhead is added to the stump, indicating the animals taken. Subsequent awards consist of additional broadheads.

To be eligible for these awards, you must have been a member of WSAA at the time the animal was taken, and you will need to apply for the award using the application form printed in this issue (or a copy thereof). The form includes instructions for submission.

WSAA would like to thank Del-Ma Archery for their support of this award by subsidizing the broadheads.

### Fair Chase Rules

Animals taken under the following conditions will not be considered for WSAA Big Game Awards or for entry into the Washington State Records System:

- "Yarded" in deep snow
- · Helpless in water
- Helpless on ice
- Helpless in a trap
- While confined behind fences as on a game farm, etc.
- In defiance of game laws or out of season
- By "jacklighting" / shining at night
- From a power vehicle or powerboat
- Any other method considered by WSAA Hunting Committee as un- sportsperson like.

### WSAA Big Buck Award

This trophy, donated by Martin Archery of Walla Walla in 1972, is a perpetual challenge trophy. It is awarded to the WSAA member taking the largest buck deer, by Pope and Young scoring, in the state of Washington. Ranking is based on the deer that comes closest to or exceeds, on a percentage basis, the state record for the respective species i.e., Mule Deer, Blacktail Deer, or Whitetail Deer. It is required that the animal meets Pope and Young minimum standards to be eligible.

To be eligible for this award, you must have been a WSAA member at the time the animal was taken, and will need to apply for the award using the form appearing in this issue (or a copy thereof). You also are required to submit a copy of the scoring form, properly filled out and signed by an official measurer. It is required that your buck be scored officially after the required 60-day drying period has elapsed.

Applications for this award must be sent to the person indicated on the form.

### **WSAA Big Bull Award**

This trophy, donated by the Grays Harbor Bowmen of Aberdeen, is a perpetual challenge trophy. It is awarded annually to the WSAA member taking the largest bull elk, by Pope and Young scoring, anywhere in North America. Ranking is based on the elk that comes closest to or exceeds, on a percentage basis, the state record for the respective species, i.e. Yellowstone or Roosevelt. It is not required that the animal meets either WSAA or Pope and Young minimum standard to be eligible.

To be eligible for this award, you must have been a WSAA member at the time the animal was taken, and will need to apply for the award using the form appearing in this issue (or a copy thereof). You also are required to submit a copy of the scoring form, properly filled out and signed by an official measurer. It is required that your bull be scored officially after the required 60-day drying period has elapsed.

Applications for this award must be sent to the person indicated on the form.
